The Schools Recommendation Scheme (SRS) gives Australian Year 12 students who have applied for undergraduate admission through UAC an opportunity to be assessed on criteria other than, or in addition to, the ATAR.

Institutions use a wide range of selection criteria, including school recommendations and senior secondary studies. They have their own policies on determining SRS eligibility and making offers.

Before you can apply for SRS, you need to apply for undergraduate admission through UAC. When you do, you'll be issued with a UAC application number, which you'll need to commence your SRS application.

Guarantee your place at ACU, even before your Year 12 exams. The ACU Guarantee program offers eligible Year 12 students a place at ACU based on your Year 11 results.

There are three offer rounds for this program, and cut-off dates for these rounds may be before the final application deadline. Offers for competitive courses, such as Nursing, Midwifery, Occupational Therapy, Paramedicine and Speech Pathology are made from Round 2. Some of these competitive courses may not notify applicants until the final offer round.

Offers may be made as early as September. While successful applicants must still complete their Year 12 exams, you can do so secure in the knowledge that your marks from Year 11 meet our entry requirements. You may also enhance your entry score by including short personal statements that give ACU an insight into your personal circumstances and motivation for university study.

Direct applications for study in 2025 open on 1 March and close on 13 May 2024 and cover admission, scholarships and guaranteed student accommodation.

Early offers made on 5th September 2024 are based on Year 11 results. ANU will honour these for study in 2025 as long as you complete Year 12 and receive an ATAR.

If your Year 11 results don't meet entry requirements, we will put you on our waiting list and automatically consider your application again based on your Year 12 results in the December/January offer rounds.

All direct applicants are required to meet the <u>co-curricular or service requirement</u> as part of their application.

All direct applicants will be covered by our <u>accommodation guarantee</u>.

For students who are interested in applying for scholarships, their eligibility is automatically assessed through our application process. There are two prestigious scholarships however that we want to call your attention to, these are the <u>Tuckwell</u> scholarship and the <u>Kambri Indigenous Undergraduate</u> <u>Scholarship</u>.

Please be advised that applying for the **Tuckwell Scholarship** is a long process and will involve a recommendation from your school- students need to be highly organised to engage in this process!

This year, CSU will have only one round of offers. Make sure you get your application in early to stay up to date with the program and what's going on at Charles Sturt.

The Charles Sturt Advantage is your chance to get into uni based on work you've already done and skills you already have. There are three rounds that you can apply for. Some of our most competitive courses will fill in the earlier rounds – so make sure you apply early.

You can apply for the Advantage if you are in Year 12, have completed Year 11 and are an Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident or New Zealand citizen.

You apply online. You'll need to attach a pdf of your Year 11 results and tell us three things:

- How a Charles Sturt degree will enable you to be a positive influence in your community.
- When you showed resilience during a difficult time.
- A time when you demonstrated empathy and why you took the actions you did.

You can preference three courses in your application. If you're successful, you'll get an offer in order of your preferences.

We consider all past and present community engagement that makes a positive contribution, such as leadership, volunteering, family support or participation.

If you're a student volunteering with one of our partner organisations, you will receive an automatic conditional offer at La Trobe University.

Year 11 Conditional Offer

The Aspire Year 11 Conditional Entry program uses your performance in Year 11 to secure you an early conditional offer into a range of courses at La Trobe.

Once you have secured your place at La Trobe you can take advantage of our other Aspire pathways to unlock access to more than 100 courses at La Trobe. It's the perfect way to take the stress out of Year 12.

It's a requirement of your conditional offer to study at La Trobe that you successfully complete year 12 and meet the minimum subject requirements and any other course prerequisites.

Unless otherwise specified and depending on when you apply, you will receive an early conditional offer two weeks* after you submit your completed application (including your Year 11 results and completed School Endorsement Form).

At Macquarie, we recognise that your ATAR doesn't necessarily reflect your achievements or potential, so we look at a variety of criteria including relevant HSC subjects, community engagement and more.

Schools Recommendation Scheme

To apply for the Schools Recommendation Scheme (SRS), you must be completing Year 12 and attaining either an Australian Year 12 qualification or an International Baccalaureate Diploma in Australia.

To apply, you must:

- Complete the SRS application when you apply for tertiary study via the <u>University Admissions Centre</u> (<u>UAC</u>). Follow the prompts to submit your application.
- Make sure you have your preferred Macquarie course up the top of your preferences to give yourself the best chance of receiving an offer through SRS.

Leaders and Achievers Early Entry Scheme

You could receive an early entry offer to study at Macquarie if you have performed well academically in Year 11 and demonstrate leadership skills, personal development and dedication through your extracurricular activities. You must meet both academic and leadership criteria.

At UC there are a number of ways you can gain admission into your preferred course.

School Recommendation Scheme

If you're a current Year 12 student, your school can recommend you for admission to the University of Canberra in advance of receiving your ATAR results, based on your abilities and success to date. Like your main application to UC, Schools Recommendation Scheme applications are also made through <u>UAC</u>.

If you apply for the SRS, your school's rating of your aptitudes will be considered, including your capacity for tertiary study. Applying through the SRS doesn't guarantee you an offer to the University of Canberra, as course quotas and other criteria still need to be considered.

If successful, you'll receive an early offer to UC for your chosen course in November.

To apply for the SRS, the first step is to speak with your school careers adviser to find out how your school is managing SRS applications. Each school can choose how they want to use SRS so it's important you find out about your school's process, selection criteria and timelines before you start.

Once you have familiarised yourself with your school's SRS application process, submit your university application through the Universities Admissions Centre (UAC). You'll then be able to use your UAC application number to start your SRS application.

University of Canberra Early Offer Round

If you're a current Year 12 student applying to UC for undergraduate study next year, you could receive an early admission offer under the Early Offer Round using criteria other than your ATAR.

Gateway Program

If you're in Year 12, the Gateway Admission Pathway is an alternative pathway to UNSW which considers more than just your ATAR. It offers early entry to UNSW or a significantly lower ATAR entry requirement for a range of degrees.

To be eligible for the Gateway Admission Pathway, you must: be an Australian resident, be completing an Australian Year 12 qualification in the year of application and attend a Gateway school or live in a lowsocioeconomic area based on IRSAD and IEO indexes of SEIFA criteria.

Critical Thinking Early Offer Scheme

A select number of degrees from our Faculty of Arts, Design & Architecture and Faculty of Law & Justice are eligible.

The UNSW Critical Thinking Early Conditional Offer Scheme allows you to showcase your critical thinking skills, demonstrating your potential to succeed at UNSW alongside your ATAR. Depending on your preferred degree, you'll complete either a critical reflection assessment or critical thinking test, with successful applicants receiving an early conditional offer with an adjusted ATAR entry requirement for their preferred degree.

Portfolio Entry Scheme

The UNSW Portfolio Entry Early Conditional Offer Scheme includes Arts, Design & Architecture Portfolio Entry and Faculty of Engineering Admissions Scheme (FEAS).

Here at UNSW, we want to reward your passion, creativity and potential to succeed in your degree area. The UNSW Portfolio Entry Scheme offers early conditional offers, giving you the opportunity to demonstrate your passion and talent alongside your ATAR.

Early Entry Program

Our free Early Entry Program means you can receive an offer from us before commencing HSC exams. Offers are conditional on you completing the HSC or equivalent.

The University of Newcastle's Early Entry Program is for NSW and ACT students completing Year 12 (Higher School Certificate or International Baccalaureate) in 2024. Early entry considers your Year 11 results so you can earn an offer to your chosen degree before you commence your exams.

You can select up to three preferences when you apply, and you can change your preferences throughout the application period. You will receive an offer based on your highest eligible preference, so make sure to put your preferred degree as your top preference.

If you do not receive an offer in the first round, you can change your preferences for the next (and final) offer round when the portal re-opens.

Schools Recommendation Scheme

The University of Newcastle offers many pathways and entry options to give you the best chance of getting into uni. One such pathway is the Schools Recommendations Scheme (SRS).

Notre Dame's Early Offer 2024 program is for Year 12 school-leavers completing the ATAR pathway. If you are currently in Year 12 completing the ATAR pathway, you have the opportunity to secure a spot at the university that emphasises the whole person. Early Offer applications will need to include your Year 11 and Year 12 school reports and we base your eligibility on your predicted ATAR. You can find out more about our Early Offer minimum academic entry requirements for our programs on our website.

To apply, you should submit your 8-digit NESA number and your NESA Student eRecord for Year 11 results ready to provide. You may also collate your Year 11 and Year 12 mid-year reports in a digital file.

We want to know more about you, not just your academic achievements! In the application, you will be asked about your non-academic commitments and you will be able to provide details. You may also wish to upload supporting documentation, which may include:

- A recommendation from your school or community group, or
- Awards, certificates, articles, curriculum vitae, etc

At Notre Dame, we consider the whole person, so get ready to tell us about yourself by answering the following questions in your application form:

- Tell us how you contribute, and how frequently, to community life.
- Why are you applying to study at Notre Dame?
- Why have you chosen to study this degree?

MySydney Entry and Scholarship

MySydney offers every <u>eligible student</u> entry on a reduced ATAR, an \$8,500 per annum scholarship for the duration of their undergraduate degree and a range of additional support. No separate application is required.

To be eligible, you must be a domestic student residing in an area listed in the bottom 25 percent according to Australian Bureau of Statistics Socio-Economic Index for Areas (SEIFA) Index of Education and Occupation (IEO) data based on the residential address you enter in your UAC undergraduate application.

To find out if you're eligible for MySydney, place a University of Sydney course in your UAC preference list. Deadlines for doing are TBA for 2025 admission. If you're eligible, place your chosen MySydney course as your highest eligible UAC preference.

Gadigal Program

The Gadigal Program is our Indigenous student pathway that supports Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students to study at the University of Sydney. The program includes the opportunity to apply for a Gadigal early conditional offer and lower minimum ATAR requirements.

Application is through UAC, and will appear when you self-identify as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and place a University of Sydney course in your UAC preferences.

Creative Arts Special Admission Scheme

The Creative Arts Special Admission Scheme offers talented Year 12 students a chance to receive an early offer to study based on their portfolio and academic performance in year 11 and 12 so far, prior to getting an ATAR. It is available for the Bachelor of Visual Arts, Bachelor of Music, Bachelor of Music (Composition) and Bachelor of Music (Composition)

No separate application is needed, you must meet the portfolio requirements by the 31 August (Bachelor of Visual Arts) or have applied to the Conservatorium for audition in either July or September (Bachelor of Music).

Details for Early Offers for 2025 admission are to be advised. Check UTS's website for updates.

The UTS Early Entry Program is designed for Year 12 students who have excelled in Year 11. It rewards the hard work and dedication that goes into preparing for the final year of school, by awarding provisional offers to successful students. Offer holders are able to accept and enrol into their UTS course before their HSC/IB exams if they wish to. It is important to note that students must still meet the minimum ATAR requirement for their course.

Schools Recommendation Scheme

Our Schools Recommendation Scheme is aimed at helping Year 12 students gain entry into university when their ATAR alone may not be sufficient. It seeks to recognise students for other skills and achievements outside their performance in Year 12, including their overall suitability for tertiary study, based on a recommendation from their school principal (or careers advisor).

Our focus is on supporting students who have the potential to succeed at university, but may not receive an offer based on their ATAR alone. Applicants must first be eligible for socio-economic disadvantage, school environment (S01C only) or financial hardship under our <u>inpUTS</u> scheme.
