Principal's Message - Rev Fr Maroun Youssef

Dear Parents and Guardians of Saint Charbel's College,

Christ is risen! He is truly risen!

It is good news which all the tongues speak about, preaching without fear that Jesus rose from Sheol. Even if we

celebrate the resurrection of our Lord, we reflect on His agony and death. When we proclaim that Jesus is risen, we implicitly acknowledge that He was among the dead. Additionally, there is no resurrection without death.

Referring to what the Scriptures spoke about Jesus, the Messiah, the Messenger of God, the Lamb of God, we see that He will come to resurrection through sufferings and passions. Sufferings and agony are the way to glory and

resurrection. If our Lord and God walked this way, being our role model, would we fear to walk the same way? When we endure suffering and pain would we remember that Jesus had endured these? Or do we fall into despair and

desolation. In reality, this is what we experience every day because how many of us struggle to continue our life in peace and tranquillity.

When we look at our society we see that the most widespread disease is anxiety and depression. How many people lose everyday their life because they feel no hope? How many people are living without goals and their life is

meaningless? They try to hide from their problems, pretending that they are busy to avoid thinking of their troubles. All of this verifies that we are so far from faith. We are so far from the principal of death and resurrection. We are so far from God, why? Let us look at Jesus in the Garden of Olives when He was praying in agony asking His Father to take away the cup of sufferings. Even if He asked for that He had hope and faith in His Father that is why He continued saying: "yet not my will, but yours be done" (Luke 22: 42).

Let us learn always when we are in agony that the resurrection is coming. When we are happy and relaxed we should prepare ourselves for the worst to come, because this life is a battle and we are its soldiers. A soldier cannot relax and sleep when he is going to defeat his enemy. They should be awake all the time ready for a fight or attack. Doing so and looking at the crucified and resurrected, our life takes a new meaning and we see the light of the resurrection through the darkness of the Tomb.

For your reference, I have attached a recent posting of some APPs that have been causing great distress to some teenagers who have access to them. I would highly encourage parents to be more proactive about knowing about the use of APPs that their children may be engaging in.
