In our work within the Primary School this Semester, we have delivered Literacy and Numeracy programs that have served to cater for the academic needs, interests and capabilities of the students under our instruction. This learning has been greatly aided and indeed revolutionised through the concerted use of Google classroom in our Enrichment Sessions. The use of this educational platform has assisted in taking learning into the 21<sup>st</sup> century in a very tangible way, serving to transfer learning beyond the classroom and into the home. A very big thank you must be extended to Mrs Giuseppina Badrous and Mrs Litsa Karamalis for the instrumental role that they have played in shaping the Enrichment program in our Primary School. speeches, discussing scenarios, and watching videos. Organisations that help with health, problems and issues were

available. This encouraged students to speak to someone, and learn what to do if problems occur. Guest speakers and real life scenarios were addressed.
