On behalf of my colleagues, I wish to extend a warm welcome back to the 2020 academic year. I sincerely would like to take this opportunity to wish you all a very happy and blessed New Year.

For our new families to our College and our community, especially our Kindergarten and new students, I would also like to take this opportunity to wish you a warm welcome to a significant relationship in the coming years.

The prime purpose of our College is to assist parents in raising their children in the Maronite Catholic faith whilst providing a sound and comprehensive education. The entire school community is responsible for creating such an environment and in our College; this is reflected through the Gospel. As parents who have entrusted your children to us, we expect your support for the goals we are striving to achieve.

We can commence the year by taking pride in congratulating the 2019 Year 12 students on their HSC success. Our students achieved 59 Band 6's across a range of subjects, with many of our courses overall results scoring well above state average. Our highest achievers were Charlie Azzi with an ATAR of 98.15 and Mary Lyn Alagha with an ATAR of 97.55. Most notably, 40% of our students achieved an ATAR of 80 and above.

Our College ranking improved from 143 in 2018 to 138 in 2019, making our College the best performing Catholic School by rank in our area.



This is a fine reflection of both the abilities of our students with their parent's support and the expertise of our teachers. We at St Charbel's College are very proud of all our students' achievements and wish all of our students past and present the very best in their future endeavours.

We celebrated the Feast of St Maroun on Saturday, 8 February. Our College commemorated this with a whole school mass on Friday 14 February. As mentioned during the Homily, I invite you all to follow in the footsteps of St Maroun, who sat himself in his goals as the grains of wheat that were fallen into the ground giving a lot of fruits. We are from these fruits and we are called to set goals in our life that will be like the grains which are going to grow and become good trees or plants. Dear Parents

Students have settled into the new academic year and have been working hard in class. It has been heartening to see families embracing the new school uniform. We have had lots of positive feedback regarding how smart the children look. The College wants to make the transition to the new uniform as easy as possible for parents, so in the event that stock of the old uniform runs out and parents cannot buy what they need, we will allow accessories of the new uniform to be worn with the old uniform. Accessories include the school hat, jumper and jacket. The only stipulation is that the boys' shirts, shorts or long pants and socks must match, and that the girls' blouses, skirts and tights must match, i.e. they must wear all the new or the old uniform. 'Tops and bottoms' cannot be mixed.

Similarly, with the sports uniform the tracksuit is considered an accessory, so if stock of the old tracksuit runs out in your child's size, the new tracksuit can be worn with the old sports uniform. Once again, the shorts, sports top and socks cannot be mixed and must be either all the new uniform, or all the old uniform. There is the option of buying the old uniform or accessories second hand from the College's uniform shop. See the Front Office if you require details regarding opening hours etc.



The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion.

Let your child make mistakes

By having to overcome normal challenges for their age and understanding that no one is perfect, your child will learn how to bounce back and be more resourceful.

By over-protecting your child and doing things for them, you deny your child important opportunities for developing resilience.

Don't fight your child's battles

Sorting out conflicts with friends and peers are important skills for healthy social relationships.

Encourage your child to talk about things that are bothering them

Learning to seek help when a problem can't be solved is an important lifelong skill.

Let your child know that unhappy or difficult times are a normal part of life and don't usually last for long.

Encourage your child to re-phrase unhelpful comments

Teach your child to turn words such as – I'm stupid or She hates me into more helpful and optimistic comments – I made a mistake, everyone makes mistakes or She doesn't hate me she just feels like playing with someone else today.

Taking responsibility

Encourage your child to take responsibility for the things they have or haven't done that may have contributed to an unhappy situation or setback.

Help your child to understand the role that 'bad luck' and the role that others may have played when they are faced with an unhappy situation or setback.

Be a positive role model for your child

- Talk your problems through with others and look for different solutions.
- Use optimistic thinking and say things out loud, such as – Things will get better soon.
- Talk about how you may have managed strong emotions in a calm way.
- Talk about your goals and how you hope to achieve them.
- · Show appreciation to others for their friendship.
