


As parents you have the magnificent role of encouraging your children to "sainthood" by allowing them to develop their qualities to the highest degree.

Year 8 PC


During their PC session, the Year 8 students worked on their monthly planner to organise their daily work in preparation for their upcoming end of year exams. We wish all our students the best of luck.


Library News


This month the Library has a special display about Remembrance Day. Each year on the 11th November we remember those who have died in war by pausing for two minutes of silence at 11am. In 1918 an armistice was signed between the Allies of World War One I and Germany. This took place on the "eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month." We often see poppies being worn on Remembrance Day. Poppies were one of the first plants to grow on the battlefields of France and Belgium. In 1921 the first silk poppies were sold to raise money for Australian soldiers who had returned from war. This is a tradition which continues today. 







