Dear Parents, it has been very busy over the last few weeks. We still have a very eventful next few weeks as we come towards the end of the term. Below I have included information for a NAPLAN School Readiness Assessment which will take place in week 9 of this term. If you have any queries please feel free to contact me at.

NAPLAN School Readiness Assessment

NAPLAN plans to start moving from pen and paper to online testing from next year. A final decision for NSW will be made after the upcoming NAPLAN Online Readiness Test which is scheduled to take place for quite a few schools nationally over the next few weeks.

NAPLAN online will have a wide range of benefits for our students and teachers, including reduced time between testing and reporting, and a tailored test design that targets questions to student ability and improves the precision of the assessment.

NESA, as the NSW NAPLAN Test Administration Authority and the three school sectors (Department of Education, Catholic Education Commission and Association of Independent Schools of NSW) are working together to coordinate the move to NAPLAN online for NSW schools.

To prepare for the move to online testing, NSW schools will participate in an online practice run, known as the NAPLAN Online School Readiness Test. The readiness test is an assessment of a school's technical readiness to administer NAPLAN Online. It is an opportunity for schools to become familiar with the NAPLAN Online test platform and to identify any technical issues they may have. It will not assess student's achievement. At St Charbel's College, our year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students will complete the readiness test during assigned sessions in Week 9 of this term. Students are not required to plan or prepare for this test as the purpose is to see if our ICT system can cope with all students using the online environment at the same time.

The readiness test is an opportunity to experience the online environment and the different question types that can be used in online testing. It is not a test of skills and knowledge. Parents of students in Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 will be sent a hard copy of a fact sheet in the coming week.

Our Grade 3 classes are now preparing for their First Holy Communion. We know that you can assist them by your prayers for students, teachers and families.














DRAMA INCURSION - PERFORMANCE+WORKSHOP

Thursday the 10th of August. Commedia dell'Arte.



On Thursday the 10th of August, our Year 9 and 10 Drama students were visited by professional actors who engaged them in a performance tailored specifically for a style of theatre called *Commedia Dell'Arte* which is a form of theatre that first originated in Italy in the 16th Century. The actors were generally known as 'street performers' and as the name suggests, performed comedic scenarios to groups of people in the streets of Italy. Its popularity grew around Europe and even famous writers like William Shakespeare were inspired by the storylines and characters that come from this style of theatre. A distinctive quality of this style of performance is the use of masks. The characters were specifically known for their over-exaggerated masks and their highly physical movements.

On the day, students viewed a 50-minute performance that introduced them to the stock characters and the history of *Commedia dell'Arte*. This was followed by a 50-minute intense workshop where the actor trainers taught our students the physicality of the characters and how to act using masks. It was a very enjoyable experience for our students who claimed it was a fun and interactive way of learning about *Commedia*.

On Wednesday the 16th of August, Year 11 students experienced an eye opening event. The *'Be Street Smart'* excursion allowed both the students and the teachers to realise the impacts of unsafe driving. In an effective method, a visual scenario engaged the students and presented the ramifications and consequences of dangerous decisions and the effects it has on people.

The scenario presented three people's road injuries and the complications undergone by paramedics, police officers and firefighters to save the lives of these people. It explained the actions that we should take if we are witnesses to a crash as well as the implications the driver had in the event for it to have taken place. This excursion was a great opportunity for the students to interact in activities and to talk to people who have experienced hardships due to road accidents. Another concept expressed in this excursion was the idea of blood, tissue and organ donation, which catalysed the students to venture into saving lives. Our school offers students aged 16 and over to donate blood. One donation can save three lives!
