5 Key Points for students to remember:

- **PRIVACY**: Place all social media apps on PRIVATE to protect you from scams or predators.
- **BE SELECTIVE**: Cull your friend lists on any social media you are using. If you do not personally know people on your list well, they will not respect your posts or personal information.
- **SAFETY FIRST**: Any suspicious activity must be reported to a responsible adult or the Police. **NEVER SHARE** personal details or photos that may reveal your location.
- THINK BEFORE YOU POST: Ask yourself Am I proud of this comment or photo? Does it represent who I really am?
- **PROTECT EACH OTHER**: Guide and protect your friends and family when they engage in Social Media.

3 Key Points for Parents:

- SET BOUNDARIES AT HOME: Have a family discussion about the dangers of the internet. We LOVE our kids keep them safe.
- **BALANCE:** Gaming Disorder is a real thing! Set time limits to gaming as it may cause aggressive behaviour, impact sleep patterns and impact physical health.
- **ASK:** Do not fall into the "but everyone is doing it" trap. It is OK to say NO! If you are unsure—speak with other parents.

The next few weeks are a busy few for the primary students. The in term swimming program begins Monday the 12th of November for two whole weeks. Just a few reminders:

Students are to wear to school:

- Sports uniform (every day for 2 weeks) including shoes
- Swimming costume (under uniform)
- Please note student must wear appropriate swimming attire. Lycra/nylon material-not clothing. Full piece swimming costumes are to be worn by girls. <u>NO BIKINIS</u>.

Students are to bring to school:

- A towel to take to the pool (and if they like a spare towel for after)
- A big shirt or dress to wear to and from the pool to cover themselves.
- Goggles. A SWIMMING CAP WILL BE GIVEN TO THEM AT THE POOL
- Thongs
- A plastic bag for wet clothes
- Underwear to change into after their swimming lesson

Students will take to the pool:

- Students will get changed out of sports uniforms at school and only wear swimmers to the pool
- A towel, thongs and goggles

Please remind students of appropriate behaviour at the pool and while getting changed, the swimming protocol that was given out can go through everything you need to know and what is expected of the students.

These two weeks of swimming are very important for the students as it allows them to further develop their swimming skills or introduce the students to skills, water familiarity and safety. As we are heading into the summer break, the students will be exposed to activities that involve water, like going to the beach, going to swim at the pools or going to water parks. It is so important for them to know the skill of swimming or just the basic skill to be able to save their lives if the need ever came up. If this is the only kind of swimming lessons your child is involved in, I really encourage you to have a look around at local pools that provide swimming lessons for your children.
