Welcome back to the new 2019 academic year in which I sincerely would like to wish you all a very happy and blessed New Year. For our new parents to the College, especially those of Kindergarten and new students, a very warm welcome to what we endeavour and trust will be a significant relationship in the next coming years.

The prime purpose of St Charbel's is to help parents raise their children in the Maronite Catholic faith as well as providing a sound comprehensive education. The entire school community is responsible for creating such an atmosphere in the College that is reflected through the Gospel. As parents, who have entrusted your children to us, we expect your support for the goals we are striving to achieve.

We can commence the year by taking pride in the HSC results for 2018. Eleven of our students achieved an ATAR of ninety or over, which is an outstanding result. The College ranking vastly improved from 162 in 2017 to 143 in 2018. This is a fine reflection of both the abilities of our students and the expertise of our teachers. We, at St Charbel's College, are very proud of all our students' achievements.

Last week we celebrated the Feast of St Maroun on Saturday, 9<sup>th</sup> February. We commemorated this with a whole school mass. I invite you all to follow in the footsteps of St Maroun, in which the Pope describes parents as the first educators of their children. St Maroun's example is as a teacher and leader in which we celebrate his heritage:

we are disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of St Peter, in the spiritual tradition of St Maroun. Let us always live as worthy ambassadors of the Maronite Catholic Faith.

### Welcome to 2019!



# elevate education

We wish to extend a welcome to our students – old and new – to another exciting year of learning, and to the celebration of the 2018 HSC results. The cohort's performance has made us very proud and we are looking forward to acknowledging them at the 2018 HSC High Achievers' ceremony on Friday 15<sup>th</sup> February.

All students are settling into their new 2019 classes and students have made final decisions on their electives as we move into the second cycle of the timetable. There are limited opportunities for change now, as most classes have reached their maximum numbers.

At St Charbel's College we aim to support students to become independent and resilient learners by providing opportunities to develop practical skills that can be implemented in their daily lessons and revision. This year we will again be using the expertise of Elevate Education to present workshops for students from Year 7 – 12 covering topics such as time management, memory development, motivation and organisation. In addition, we have organised for Elevate Education to present a parent workshop during our 7-12 Parent Information evening on Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> February. The workshop will cover:

- how parents can help students manage their time effectively
- how parents can help their students become motivated and stay motivated
- the different types of work that students

- should prioritise across the year in order to improve their results
- how parents can help their children work effectively with technology whilst minimising distractions like Instagram, Facebook etc.

Whilst student attendance at the information evening is not compulsory, at least one parent from each family must attend.

The information evening will commence at 6.30pm and address the following items:

- Maronite Catholic education and mission
- Pastoral care and wellbeing
- Curriculum and assessment
- Elevate Education Parent Presentation

### Director of Primary (K-6) - Ms Maree Kelly

Dear Parents,

Welcome back to the new year! There are many exciting happenings in the Primary School and it's reflected in the positive atmosphere that is noticeable as I walk around the campus.

The Primary School has welcomed new staff this year: Miss Rebecca Belcastro (KG), Miss Louise Grady (KM), Miss Adele Gazzola (4P), Miss Nicole Lumagbas (5M) and Miss Patricia Kazacos (Learning Support department).

The Primary School has introduced new class codings this year: Generosity, Honesty, Mercy and Patience. These reflect the values of the Maronite Catholic Identity framework and allow the class to align themselves with these values rather than the initials of the teacher.

The school is pleased to have the new Kindergarten playground area open. The students have embraced their new play area with enthusiasm.

Reading and spelling in Years K-2 is being supplemented by the Get Reading Right program, also referred to as Synthetic Phonics. An expert in this area, Justin Caban, will be running a Parent Information evening on Monday 8 April for K-2 parents. Details will be sent home shortly. Part of the role of a school is to help students become independent in order to prepare them for the real world. This begins when students arrive at school in the morning. If you bring your children to school, please leave the premises immediately to allow your child to settle in and develop their social skills independently.

The exception is Kindergarten parents in the first few weeks of school.

The school has been looking at semester awards and changing their focus. In Primary School, staff believe it is far more important that the students strive to do their best work and achieve their potential. If the school seems to focus on marks, this can have a detrimental effect on students because they always feel pressured to get full marks, or come first and believe they are compared unfavourably to other students.

Thus in Primary School the emphasis is very much on the journey, not the end result. Accordingly, there is only one award given at the end of Semester One for a student in each class who has stood out in every regard during

Semester One: academically and in their behaviour and attitude to their work, teachers and peers, thereby being a good role model for all students. Class teachers select the student in the same way as they do for Teacher Certificates awarded during the term: they consider students' academic results, as well as their aptitude and behaviour and they consult with specialist teachers to con-

Welcome to Stage 3.

We are pleased to welcome the Year 5 students into the senior classes of our school. We also welcome our Student Representative Council and for the first time at St Charbel's College, our Primary Colour House Captains. We have a very keen team of student leaders who have some wonderful ideas and initiatives in store for 2019. Our focus for Stage 3 this year is to develop independent, responsible and organised learners. These are skills which will serve our students well in Secondary School.

Year 5 will sit their NAPLAN test at the start of Term 2 from 14-16 May 2019. We will be working to prepare our students for these tests.

Year 6 will soon be undertaking an overnight educational tour of our national capital in Term 2. Students will be given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy. This will support our History Unit, Australia as a Nation. The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$20 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion.

We are very pleased to welcome our Stage 3 team of dedicated and inspiring teachers, some of whom are new to our school. In Year 5 we have Miss Jackson, Miss Lumagbas and Miss Arraj. In Year 6 we have Miss Kokla, Mrs Papasavvas, Mrs Zubak with Mrs Abrahim and Mrs Leas with Mrs Troncoso.

We encourage you all to make a suitable time to meet your child's teacher. We are here to work with you as a team for the best interest of your children so please feel free to discuss with us any concerns you may have.

Chess classes for students from Years 1-6 were a huge success last year. Sydney Chess Academy has been running chess classes at our school every Friday at lunch times. The students have loved learning strategies and challenging themselves. During each class there is a tuition session followed by practical application of skills through playing with an opponent.
